
Used almost exclusivly as a "weapon" in 2021 while playing with Emory Jones at Florida. Richardson was named to the freshman All-SEC Team after completing just 38 pass attempts, but passing is not what Anthony Richardson is best known for. In week 1 against Florida Atlantic, Richardson took 7 rush attempts for 160 yards and a touchdown... by the end of the season, he compiled 401 yards on the ground with just 51 attempts.

In 2022, Richardson was given the keys to the offense at Florida, and dispite his completion percentage dropping to 53% he still threw for 2,549 yards and 17 touchdowns, this caused my evaluators to attempt to push Richardson back to College in 2023. But after racking up over 650 yards on the ground and 9 touchdowns, it should have been obvious – Richardson is built for the current age of the NFL. With the highest upside among quarterback prospects in the 2023 class, Richardson looks to follow in the steps of other rushing quarterbacks like Cam Newton, Justin Fields, Lamar Jackson and Jalen Hurts.





Ohio State's ONLY two-time Heisman Trophy finalist. Storud finished 4th in 2021, and 3rd in 2022 while playing with the likes of Chris Olave, Garrett Wilson, Jaxon Smith-Njigba and Marvin Harrison.

In two seasons as the starter at Ohio State, Stroud finished 21–4 with over 345 passing yards in each of the 4 losses. Ohio State beat Utah in the 2021 Rose Bowl, and gave Georgia the best game of the season in the 2022 National Semi–Final with a narrow 42–41 loss. Georgia would eventually defeats TCU 65–7 in the Championship, so many look at the Ohio State as the defacto National Championship Game. Stroud finished his career in Columbus with 8,123 passing yards and anincredible 8 to 1 touchdown to interception ratio.



Entering 2022, Will Levis was regarded as a Top-3 quarterback prospect with upside, playing at Kentucky is different than Ohio State, and Alabama, I don't need to tell you that. But what everyone wanted to see, was an improvement in multiple facets of the game, including completion percentage, rushing, ability to win and elevate, and for Levis to have less heady mistakes and interceptions. He did very little to improve that stock in 2022, while also aquiring a foot injury that caused him to miss the South Carolina game.

Levis has the strongest arm in the 2023 Class, and it will arguably be top-5 in the nfl in the coming season. But there is a ways to go between now and then, if Will is going to be the top pick in the 2023 draft or have a long career in the NFL. Think of Levis like a Patrick Mahomes or Josh Allen as a prospect, Big Prototypical frame, with above average rushing ability, a cannon for an arm, with tendancies to be eratic. He is far from a Trevor Lawrence level prospect, but Levis is as close to a complete quarteback as we currently have in the 2023 class.



As the 2021 Heisman Trophy winner, Young finished with a 23-4 record at Alabama, the 8th winningest QB in school history. Young met all expectations at Alabama, except for winning a national championship as the starting quarteback, he did win one while backing up Mac Jones in 2020.

Bryce accounted for 178 total touchdowns in high school at the legendary Mater Dei, and he chose Alabama over USC, whom he grew up watching. The question with Bryce Young was NEVER about talent, it was always about size - many expect Bryce to be a top-3 pick in the 2023 NFL Draft, but there has been rumors of worried General Managers when discussing a quarterback that may come in south of 190lbs.

Not only was Duggan a competent passer, but he showed off his 4.58 forty yard dash from The Opening in high school, finishing with 555 yards on the ground and 6 scores.

Improving from 53% to 63% passing in two seasons with Gary Patterson as the head coach, was impressive by itself, but Max was still not on NFL evaluators minds entering his 2022 campaign. TCU had finished with 5, 6 and 5 wins in each of those seasons. In 2022, Patterson was let go, and Sonny Dykes brought a perenniel top-20 scoring attack from SMU up to TCU. Not only did TCU increase from 28.7(66th) to 38.8(10th) in points per game, but established themselves as a power house in the Big-12, thanks to Duggan and his connection with fellow NFL prospects Quentin Johnston, Derius Davis and Kendre Miller.

Even though Demarcado is an older prospect, he does possess decent speed for his size. He will be an interesting prospect to monitor as we approach the NFL Draft


